

SAVE EAST COKER

At the Full Council meeting on 5 March, SSDC approved its Local Plan which sets out the Council's strategy for development in South Somerset to 2028. Following discussion of the various stages leading to the final version of the Plan, the councillors voted to "adopt" it although it was notable that a number of Conservatives, including Marcus Fysh, abstained.

This means that the framework for the development of housing and employment land will soon become a legal document which will enable the Council to oppose any proposals which do not fall within the locations specified in the Local Plan.

Having succeeded in getting the number of houses SSDC wanted to develop in East Coker down from their initial 5,000 to 3,800, to 2,500 then 1,600, and finally 800 at Keyford, the community now needs to focus its attention on the Outline Planning Application recently submitted to SSDC by the developer for the site, Charles Bishop.

Following the public meeting in the East Coker Hall, on 25 March, organised by East Coker Parish Council, we hope you will send your comments and objections to the Council so that it can take steps to ensure that the final design of the planning proposal includes modifications to remove the major impacts on the local community, particularly resulting from the extra traffic it will cause in the area.

The Save East Coker campaign will scrutinise the Keyford plans, and where appropriate will retain planning and legal expertise to argue our case against the impact of the proposed development, so please continue to support us through the fundraising programme.

Visits are arranged during the year to places and gardens of interest.



We recently celebrated the wonderful world of books. Our children and staff greeted World Book Day in the most colourful display of costumes you could imagine. The theme for the day was Colour in Books and this gave the children, and their parents, a wide choice of outfits. Some went for well-known stories with colourful characters; others just got their brightest and boldest out of the wardrobe. We started the day with a parade and the effect was dazzling.

In classes during the day, lots of activities gave the children the chance to enjoy themselves while celebrating the worlds of imagination and imagery. We shared our activities with a special assembly at the end of the day.

World Book Day marked the end of a special Reading Challenge. The children were asked to take part in a sponsored fundraising effort to support our building development – a lovely new teaching room replacing some tired and scruffy storage rooms. Neighbourhood Plan

Many thanks for the 55 responses we received to the community engagement on our draft Vision Statement, Objectives and Policy Intents. As a result of the comments, we have made some amendments and the revised document is posted on the East Coker Parish Council website www.eastcokerparish.com/neighbourhood-plan/community-engagement-2015

We are now working on the production of draft policies, which in turn will lead to a draft Neighbourhood Plan (NP). Our current work has been sent to South Somerset District Council who has to produce a Strategic Environmental Assessment Screening Report, as well as commenting on our Policy Intents. They aim to complete this by the end of May, however they advise us to continue working on the draft policies

and NP in the meantime. During the three years that we have been working on this, we have acquired £20,000 of funding from central government, meaning that the work has not impacted on the Precept. However, this does not take into account the hundreds of voluntary hours of work freely given by the members of the Steering Group and other parishioners. As I will stand down from this co-ordination role at the end of April (at the same time as standing down from the Parish Council), I would like to publicly thank all those people who have unstintingly supported the work for more than three years. I hope that the successful completion of the NP happens before too long.

Parish Ranger

Youth Activity

The existing funding acquired to support the Youth Activities finishes in August 2015. The Parish Council has voted in principle to put aside money to continue to fund this activity for a further year from that time. The meetings take place at the Pavilion on Monday evenings. Future Projects

After consideration was given to the upgrading of the **Chapel**, it was considered that the very high cost of such work was prohibitive and it was resolved that only necessary maintenance be undertaken as needed.

Maintenance is needed on the **Pavilion** and will be undertaken following detailed costings.

After much deliberation, it has been agreed that it will be a valuable asset to the parish to resurface the **Pavilion car park** and upgrade the facilities within the adjoining **children's play park**. This work will take place during March/April 2015.

Parish Council Website

The Parish Council is very grateful to Matt Horsley for the large amount of voluntary work that he has done in support of the website.

It has been agreed that Keith Taylor will be employed to support the future development and enhancement of the website, together with offering training to the Clerk in Waiting.

Nippy Bus Service

Following the recent survey, Somerset County Council has informed Syd Hardy of Nippy Bus Limited that the N8 Saturday service will cease operating after service on 23 May 2015. Their website will be updated accordingly.

Community Grant

East Coker Primary School has been granted £500 from ECPC Community grant fund to help provide facilities for practical cookery, which became a statutory part of the National Curriculum for children from 5-13 years of age from September 2014.

Outline application for development of Sustainable Urban Extension – Keyford

Mr Simon Fox, Planning Officer, SSDC and Mr John Bishop, Keyford Landowners, attended the March meeting of ECPC to explain and answer questions about this outline planning application. Further meetings are planned before the decision is expected by 27 May 2015 (according to SSDC website at the time of writing.)

End of current Council's term of office


