EAST COKER VILLAGE HALL CHARITABLE TRUST

As mentioned in previous copies of the East Coker Society Newsletter, the options for the repair/replacement of the roof had been under investigation for several months. A final decision has been taken by the hall trustees and it is anticipated that work will commence on replacing the roof later this year, most likely in September/October. Grants have been, and are being, applied for. We were successful in our application to the Queen's Platinum Jubilee Fund. The anticipated cost of these works and improvements is circa £110,000. We have now raised just under half of the funds needed.

Any help towards raising funds for this project will be greatly appreciated, as will any donations towards the project. Your Village Hall is used by a variety of organisations, classes, parties and for village events. We are extremely fortunate to have such a facility, which the trustees are keen to maintain and improve to as high a standard as possible.



- 4. If you haven't exhibited before, do not try to enter too many classes! Don't be afraid to enter as help will be available on the day to show you where, and how, to place your entries.

Have a go and enjoy doing it. It is fun, rewarding and an excellent afternoon out, and not forgetting the delicious homemade cakes available to savour with your cup of tea along with the friendly company.




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EAST COKER POETRY GROUP

Stick insects, Olympics, Radiographers, piglets, Sports Day, ZooLab, the 5 Senses and a party. Just some of the curious, astounding, interesting, conversation provoking and learning situations the playgroup children, staff and parents and carers get into. Our parents and carers are wonderful at contributing to the life of the Playgroup and we thank them so much.

We have never had stick insects in all the years I have been here and so far, so good. The tiny insects are growing, the children enjoy watching the weekly changing of the vegetation and enjoy dropping water onto the leaves. The greatest fun is watching out for escaping stick insects while I dab around with damp kitchen roll 'picking' up the poo. There are 4, a great real life counting opportunity, observing carefully to find 4 (they camouflage into the vegetation very well), we monitor their growth and care for them, so many learning opportunities!

Our fundraising Olympics event raised just over £500 and a big thank you goes out to everyone who supported the event in all the ways they could. We have had wonderful visits from Radiographers (with x-rays!) and return visits by piglets and a tiny kid goat. Still to do this half term is Sports Day, a visit from ZooLab, finding out more about our Five Senses and the end of term Party.

The Scouts entered a patrol in the Senior East Somerset Camping Competition. 
EAST COKER PRIMARY SCHOOL

This year has been an incredibly busy one for all of us at East Coker Primary. We are extremely proud of the achievements our pupils have made this year and the wide range of projects they have engaged with.

In the autumn term, we had our Year 6 residential at Great Wood Camp which is always a great week. Staff give up their time to enable our children to take part in new experiences, some not

having stayed away from home before. They took part in archery, team building activities, blindfold walks through streams, climbing walls, grass sledging and much more. Photos can be found on the school website www.eastcokerschool.co.uk.

This year we have had educational visits to Melbury Estates and Foxdown Farm as well as an activity day at Yeovil Town Football Club and a Year 5 and Year 6 residential. We have had visitors in from different professions, several theatre groups, explosive science days as well helping to save the planet through workshops




As a school, we pride ourselves in the wider curriculum we provide. This has always been a strength of East Coker school. In April, we achieved the National Wellbeing Gold award following our development on raising attainment with wellbeing. Staff have also given up their free time after school to provide additional clubs for our children. This year, we have had many varied sports clubs including football, basketball, cricket, tennis, and quidditch, watercolour club, photography, choir and board games, to name a few. We are also very lucky to have a sports coach who leads clubs and fixtures, and the children have attended many competitions from football to athletics and from swimming to dance. They always achieve well in sport. In cross country, once again, a number of pupils represented the school in the Area Schools County Cross Country Competition. We also qualified for the Cricket County Finals, in which we finished 6th in the whole of Somerset! A fantastic achievement!

We have also worked closely with the local community. OSR Projects in West Coker has delivered some clay workshops for our pupils and we have also worked with them taking part in Book Making at the Od Arts Festival and viewing the exhibits around East Coker.

We are currently working towards our Arts Mark award and this year we have embedded a culture of pupil led performances. We held a Music Festival in June, which included working with music students from Plymouth University, which enabled us to support our children to create their own 'bands' playing guitar, drums and vocals. You may have heard the performances in the village!

Following on from new government guidance in February 2024 for schools to ensure we have wrap around care for our parents which meets their working needs, the school is starting its own Wraparound Care Service from September, run by school staff, from 7.30am to 6.00pm, five days a week.

In the summer holidays, the school already offers a fantastic array of activities to support our parents with childcare, and the Wraparound Care from September will be a natural extension of this.



This is an exciting venture for us, and we are looking forward to providing a high-quality Breakfast and After School Club provision on a par with the high-quality summer club we provide. We have specifically kept costs down to further support our community.

Our fantastic PTFA committee, a very small team of four parents, have worked tirelessly this year to plan and deliver some great events, raising a lot of money for the school community. We have had a Bingo evening, a children's disco, lots of competitions and the Summer Fair. Our Year 6 children ran a number of stalls to help raise money for the school. Without the money raised by the PTFA, we would not have been able to have two theatre company visits, support all our families with reduced costs on educational visits, supply equipment such as the Viking Longboat and ensure that all our Year 3 pupil receive music tuition for a term. This is in addition to many other events and projects they support the school with.

We are also very lucky to have an exceptionally hard-working group of governors who voluntarily give up their time to help move the school forward, continually ensuring the school can deliver the very best for the children and parents of East Coker Primary School. They have led the school through some challenging but necessary change this year. They have tracked the strategic development of the school ensuring we continue to perform well academically as well as provide a strong pastoral provision.

This year, our results are again looking to be on track for above national average in phonics and are showing great outcomes in Early Years. The children have made further improvements in the Year 4 Multiplication test and the progress our children have made since the start of the year has been strong.

Last summer, we had an Ofsted inspection which praised the school in many areas and identified it as continuing to be a good school. This summer, we have had a visit from the Local Authority who particularly praised the care and support systems in place which enable all our staff to provide high quality care for our most vulnerable pupils.

ST MICHAEL AND ALL ANGELS' CHURCH

We are delighted to announce that a new Rector for the Parish and Benefice has been appointed. The Reverend Philip Macaulay will be taking up the position later this summer. Phil grew up in Somerset and spent time as a church youth worker in Yeovil before studying theology, first at Middlesex University and then for an MA at Durham. He has served his curacy in a parish in the St Albans Diocese, and this will be his first incumbency. Despite his tender age (!) Phil has a wealth of experience having stood in as priest in charge during a parish vacancy, worked as a hospital chaplain and been involved in inter-faith outreach, in addition to his work with young people. I am sure many across the parish will share our excitement at Phil's appointment and look forward to welcoming him to East Coker. Details of his installation/service of welcome will be announced in due course. When we have an idea of his arrival date, we will organise a less formal meet and greet event to which you will all be invited.

In the meantime, we have had plenty going on in the church over the past few months. As well as our routine services, we have had a baptism (Evelyn), joined the rest of the Benefice for a wonderful outdoor service in Pendomer, and on the first weekend in July saw the marriage of Eleanor and Sam – all of them such happy occasions.

We held a very successful Open Morning and Plant and Produce sale at the church in June. As well as plants and produce, the morning included tower visits, a mouse hunt, teas and coffees and a raffle. An incredible £721.75 was raised for St Margaret's Hospice Care. Thank you to all those who supported the event and the amazing organisers. Watch this space for more church events!

We plan to celebrate Harvest on Sunday 22 September this year. As well as a service of celebration, we will sit down to share a meal. Please join us if you can – everybody is very welcome. The following Sunday, 29 September, is the Feast Day of St Michael and we plan to host the rest of the Benefice in East Coker for Michaelmas (St Michael's Mass). You are always welcome in St Michael's, but particularly for these special events.

There has been a great deal of work going on in the background related to Project Beacon, our plans to make the church more accessible and to make it a more versatile community space. We have all but concluded consulting with the very many organisations which are involved in such projects and have submitted our final (but still outline) proposal to the Diocesan Advisory Committee. EAST COKER PARISH COUNCIL

Village Meeting

On Wednesday 22 May 2024, the ECPC hosted an Annual Village Meeting in East Coker Hall.

It was heartening that it was well attended by parishioners who wanted to find out what the PC does and to meet the councillors themselves during a meeting that for several reasons had not been held for a few years. It was also an opportunity to meet the wealth of wonderful clubs and societies that East Coker has to offer which were there to promote themselves.

The Chair of ECPC, Cllr Huxley Cowen, welcomed parishioners in a brief speech and spoke of the many achievements of the council over the last year and highlighted the aims for this year.

Chief amongst these is the project to modernise the Pavilion which, having been delayed by the pandemic and the subsequent dramatic increase in building costs, has had to be revised and re-costed. A new design was presented at the meeting, and this will be refined before re-applying for planning permission in the next couple of months. A full fundraising drive is now underway with borrowing, grant applications and savings being considered, together with initiatives such as local events and the new 100 Club (see below).

The Cemetery is also in the process of being re-landscaped by the PC at the same time as making more space for future graves, which was becoming a pressing problem. As the badgers are carefully moved out and unwanted trees and shrubs are removed, it will look messy for a while but will become much more open and attractive in years to come.

Cllr Cowen also mentioned the request for funds made by Yeovil Town Council to support their commitment to keep the major facilities in the town functioning and maintained now that Somerset Council have had to cut these from their overstretched budget. As one of the surrounding parishes, YTC feel it would be appropriate if East Coker parishioners could contribute as they are very likely to use some or all of these facilities (the Sports & Recreation Ground, the Octagon Theatre, the Westland Leisure Centre and Yeovil Country Park). He asked for feedback from those present as to whether the PC should make an annual contribution from its budget. This was collected and will be part of the decision-making process for next month's meeting.

The Keyford development is still in the planning process so the PC will be keeping a close eye on any changes/issues as they arise.

For the rest of the evening, parishioners were encouraged to meet the councillors and club representatives while partaking of the drinks and nibbles on offer.

All the councillors would like to thank everyone who attended and would ask you to please keep your diary free for Wednesday 20 May 2025 for the next Annual Village Meeting!

New Speed Indicating Device (SID) in the village of East Coker

The SID has been placed at least once in all 4 of its positions on approaches to the village and we now have been able to download data from it. Similar to other SIDs around the country, this shows that the majority drive within the legal limits. For example, over a two-week period in June when located on the Yeovil Road by Tellis Cross, 90% entering North Coker and 79% leaving in the Yeovil direction were at or below 30mph. It is unlikely that the temporary 20mph school zone has a significant effect on these readings. Many drivers find SIDs a useful reminder to be aware of their speed.

Unfortunately, a small minority do not and drive far too fast, ignoring possible hazards. It's hoped the SID will make a difference to safety but remember that even 30mph is often too fast within the village of East Coker.

100 Club

There is still time to enter the 100 club, the proceeds of which go towards the modernisation of the Pavilion at the sports ground in Long Furlong Lane.

It is £10 per ticket, to be paid for by a monthly standing order, running for a minimum of 12 months. The prizes are 1st prize - £120, 2nd prize - £60, 3rd prize - £20, and already there have been 15 prize winners.
