

During the last few months, members have heard about naughty plants, the flora of north and south Greece, enjoyed a tour of the gardens at Hymerford House followed by afternoon tea at the garden of two of our members, and had an illustrated talk on the Jurassic Coast by a club member. In June, on a true summer's day, we enjoyed a trip to Fursdon House, where the Fursdon family has lived since 1259, and continue to live today. During the growing season, there is a produce stall, stocked by members with plants and produce. Vouchers offering discounts on seeds, seed potatoes, young plants and seedlings are available during January and February, with offers on spring bulbs and over wintering onions and shallots come summer. Bulk order discounts are available to members during January with special order forms for sundry goods, such as compost. Twice a year, there is a growing competition. Bulbs will be distributed in the autumn for the competition to be held next Spring. Day trips are arranged to places of interest.

We are a friendly lot – why not join us for an enjoyable, sociable evening? You do not need to be good at gardening; talks cover a wide variety of subjects. The annual subscription is currently £20, with subs of £2 per meeting. Visitors £5. We have now raised just over half of the funds needed. We are hopeful that applications in the pipeline for further grants will be successful. EAST COKER PRIMARY SCHOOL

We have had a fantastic start to our new academic year. The children are all looking extremely smart in their uniforms and teachers have been very impressed with their behaviour and attitudes to learning.

We have been having a bit of work done over the holidays, and thanks to the hard work of our Site Manager, we now have a lovely new fitted kitchen and newly painted Kingfishers room for our own Breakfast Club and After School Club service, which started in September. We are now open to our school community from 7.30am to 6.00pm! The children have been really enjoying making pinwheel pizzas for snacks, playing with all the toys and using the school grounds, despite the wet weather trying to put a dampener on things!

Over the past few years, we have been focusing on improving phonics across the school which resulted in us being in the top 2% of schools nationally, as we scored 100% in our phonics tests last year. We have been above national continually in this area for a few years, so this year we will be focusing more of our attention on Mastering Number from Reception to Year 3. We will be working with the Boolean Maths Hub to fully embed number across the lower age range so when they get to Year 4 and beyond, they are very confident and quick in their use of number.





We are in our second year of our Raising Attainment with Mental Health and Wellbeing and will be focusing on the role of peer mediators. Last year we were successful in achieving the gold award in National Whole School Wellbeing, which is the highest award presented, making us a National Wellbeing School.

Free whole class brass lessons for Year 3 are already underway (thanks to fundraising by the PTFA), and we have our Year 6 residential coming up in the next two weeks. Our topic this term is Scrumdidlyumptious, and we will be learning all about food. The older children will be finding out about the Mayans, and of course, they will be making and designing their very own chocolate bar!

Can you help us improve our Lunchtime Play?

As part of our lunchtimes, we are looking for items to support the children's play. If you were thinking of throwing out any of the following, we would gladly take it instead:

• Sand Pit: sand pit moulds, sand castle buckets, plastic rakes and sieves etc.

- **Dressing up area**: puppets, doctor/nurse kits, adult hats, adult waistcoats, scarves, wigs, clip on ties, dressing up clothes for older children (not Halloween), accessories, old computer keyboard, old telephones not glass.
- Wheel zone: working scooters, toy cars and trucks, prams and buggies for dolls, soft toys which fit
 in a buggy.
- Archaeological dig site: dustpan and brush, range of clean make up brushes, paint brushes.
- Imaginative play area: plastic toy animals, dinosaurs, play mobile, dollies, Lego etc.
- Art Area: art/DIY paint brushes/rollers, clean paint trays, clean squeezy bottles, crafting supplies, chalks, wall paper or liner, paint trays (clean), rollers (clean), decorating brushes (clean), empty spray bottles, squeezy bottles.
- **Den Building area**: pegs, nets, wooden bits/planks/squares (no nails), old bunk bed ladders, wooden pallets, cable drums, pop up tents, cardboard or very large wooden boxes/crates, fabrics, outdoor cushions and rugs.

By the time of publication of this Newsletter, we will have held our **Open Day on Saturday 5 October** from 10.00am-12.00pm. This is an opportunity for prospective parents to have a good look around the school and find out what life is like for the children at East Coker Primary schools and the opportunities on offer.

If you feel you would like to offer your expertise to support the school, we would be more than happy to hear from you. If you would like to help at a strategic level, we have a vacancy in our governing body (see flyer accompanying this Newsletter). Meetings are once every three months at the school. Here we discuss the strategic direction of the school alongside discussions about school improvement.

ST MICHAEL AND ALL ANGELS' CHURCH

It has been a quiet summer for the church. Alongside our normal pattern of worship, much of our time has been spent preparing ourselves for the arrival of the new Rector, the Reverend Philip Macaulay. 

As we enter into the latter part of summer, with the amount of rain and sun we have had – all our hedgerows and lawns are growing like crazy!!

At our latest meeting we had a discussion on some of the overgrown hedges and pathways within our parish.

Bird nesting months are typically between March and August, so after 1 September, could we please ask that if your hedges back onto public roads, pavements or pathways, they are cut back to allow pedestrians to pass and vehicles, and cyclists to be seen.

There is now a defibrillator at the Café for use in the village. Please note this is only accessible when the Café is open. The Café opening times are Tuesday- Friday 9am-4pm and Saturday 9am-12pm.

SID Update for Yeovil Road 6 - 18 September

Reading the following it is important to remember that the primary purpose of the SID (Speed Indicator Device) is to remind road users of their speed when entering the potentially hazardous area of our village. The consequences of speeding are still the responsibility of the driver. Those who chose to ignore the reminder are a minority of road users, but it only takes one inconsiderate individual to cause a fatality. In addition, the SID settings have to be 30mph although this is rarely a safe speed in much of the village area. Given the location by Tellis Cross, many of the vehicles would have been slowing for the turn in, for oncoming traffic or the reduced 20mph school zone. Similarly, those leaving Tellis Cross would have given a 'false' reading.

Without these factors skewing the results, the speeds for many would be higher. During this time 7,381 vehicles entered and 10,831 left the village along this route. 90% of inbound and 80% of outbound were below 30mph..39 incoming and scarily 132 outgoing vehicles were recorded over 40mph..The speed limit only changes to 40mph after regular housing and the Longlands Lane turn for very good reason, but the importance of this is clearly lost on 1 in 5 drivers who are already over 30mph as they pass Tellis Cross. Highest recorded speeds are not openly shared as this can encourage some towards recklessness, but they are recorded at times of day when plenty of others would be around, for example, afternoon school and early evening.

20mph School Zone

With the start of the new school year, it is worth noting that when in operation the 20mph extends from one sign to the next, that is, leaving the village on Yeovil Road cars should do 20mph up to Tellis Cross if the lights were flashing on the way in. We are still awaiting an additional 20mph school sign from the county council on the approach from Higher Burton, but this is on the way.
